## **Welcome to Mascoma Valley Regional School District**

Located in the scenic Mascoma Valley, the district serves approximately 1,100 students from five New Hampshire towns: Canaan, Dorchester, Enfield, Grafton and Orange.

The posted position will use the Indian River School as a home base. Indian River School recently joined the New England League of Middle Schools. The League advocates for programs that improve academics and the social/emotional culture of a school. In 2020, the school began using Positive Behavior Intervention Strategies (PBIS), a three-tiered program for improving behavior.

Each student at Indian River has his/her/their own laptop, which provides increased academic access. Students have opportunities to participate in student government, sports, and clubs.

Community partnerships with Dartmouth, Friends of Mascoma Feeding Friends Food Pantry, Careers CLIC, Leaders in Prevention, the Byrne Foundation, Walker Foundation, and Wellbourne Foundation all provide opportunities for teachers and students to access activities and events that improve their lives.

The position will offer both school specific and district wide opportunities. School specific opportunities include, but are not limited to:

- Providing students, from grades 5-8, individual and group services to improve social skills and appropriate behavior (using positive intervention strategies)
- Collaborating, consulting and coordinating with students, staff and families to develop support plans
- Providing recommendations/referrals for additional mental health services
- Conducting crisis and/or risk assessments
- Developing of trust, open communication and mutual respect with students, families and staff

District wide opportunities include, but are not limited to:

- Working on advocacy for marginalized groups (students living in poverty, displaced students, students involved in the juvenile justice system, etc.)
- Assisting in development of school wide mental health and wellness programs
- Working with the current district Social Worker to provide wrap-around care to students
- Working with community partners
